Logistics

Logistics will be a major element of any spill response. The term logistics covers any activity dealing with the movement of equipment, personnel, waste material or other elements that contributes to the response.

A key element to the success in dealing with a large spill is the effective ability to move personnel and equipment into and out of the incident area easily. There will be issues that response elements should coordinate together to help provide a more efficient and effective response. These areas include:

Customs and Immigration: Recognizing that time is of the essence during a response, each country may identify customs and immigration officials that can work with their counterparts in other participating countries to assist with the transfer of personnel and equipment expeditiously across national borders as appropriate.

Disposition of Recovered Oil: Oil recovered by mechanical means from the sea rapidly grows in volume, and recovered oil should be brought to shore for proper disposal. Each participating country may identify a point of contact for oversight of the process, including determining the location for disposing the recovered oil. Generally, it is assumed that the affected country should receive all recovered oil from its EEZ and territorial sea. If the affected country is unable to receive the recovered oil, that country should identify alternate means of disposal. In cases where oil moves out of its EEZ it may be more practical to have the recovered oil brought to another location to keep transit times and costs to a minimum. The details should be determined through dialogue between the respective points of contact in the affected countries during response activities.

Waste Management: Waste from response activities can also grow in size rapidly and includes oil soaked boom, absorbent material, and other waste generated by the response. The issue can be particularly challenging for island nations that may have limited resources (incinerators and landfills) to deal with the large volume of waste. Each response organization may identify points of contact for managing the final disposition of this waste. Proper coordination of this aspect is key, as responders from outside the affected country should understand local labeling and handling requirements for waste brought to shore. Generally, it is assumed that the affected country should receive all waste material generated in its EEZ and territorial sea. In cases where oil moves out of its EEZ it may be more practical to have the waste material brought to another location, for example to keep transit times and costs to a minimum. The details should be determined through dialogue between the respective points of contact in the affected countries during response activities.

Logistics

Logistics will be a major element of any spill response. The term logistics covers any activity dealing with the movement of equipment, personnel, waste material or other elements that contributes to the response.

A key element to the success in dealing with a large spill is the effective ability to move personnel and equipment into and out of the incident area easily. There will be issues that response elements should coordinate together to help provide a more efficient and effective response. These areas include:

Customs and Immigration: Recognizing that time is of the essence during a response, each country may identify customs and immigration officials that can work with their counterparts in other participating countries to assist with the transfer of personnel and equipment expeditiously across national borders as appropriate.

Disposition of Recovered Oil: Oil recovered by mechanical means from the sea rapidly grows in volume, and recovered oil should be brought to shore for proper disposal. Each participating country may identify a point of contact for oversight of the process, including determining the location for disposing the recovered oil. Generally, it is assumed that the affected country should receive all recovered oil from its EEZ and territorial sea. If the affected country is unable to receive the recovered oil, that country should identify alternate means of disposal. In cases where oil moves out of its EEZ it may be more practical to have the recovered oil brought to another location to keep transit times and costs to a minimum. The details should be determined through dialogue between the respective points of contact in the affected countries during response activities.

Waste Management: Waste from response activities can also grow in size rapidly and includes oil soaked boom, absorbent material, and other waste generated by the response. The issue can be particularly challenging for island nations that may have limited resources (incinerators and landfills) to deal with the large volume of waste. Each response organization may identify points of contact for managing the final disposition of this waste. Proper coordination of this aspect is key, as responders from outside the affected country should understand local labeling and handling requirements for waste brought to shore. Generally, it is assumed that the affected country should receive all waste material generated in its EEZ and territorial sea. In cases where oil moves out of its EEZ it may be more practical to have the waste material brought to another location, for example to keep transit times and costs to a minimum. The details should be determined through dialogue between the respective points of contact in the affected countries during response activities.
